Having regard to the following:

- the establishment, for the academic year 2019-2021, of the ERASMUS MUNDUS JOINT MASTER DEGREE (post-graduate Master Course) in "ARCHITECTURE, LANDSCAPE, ARCHAEOLOGY" jointly offered by Sapienza University of Rome (coordinating institution), National Technical University of Athens, University of Coimbra, University of Naples Federico II;
- the call for admissions to the ERASMUS MUNDUS JOINT MASTER DEGREE in ARCHITECTURE, LANDSCAPE, ARCHAEOLOGY (EMJMD ALA), Department of Architecture and Design/Department of Antiquity Sciences Sapienza University, School of Architecture /National Technical University of Athens, Greece, Department of Architecture / University of Coimbra, Portugal, Department of Architecture/Department of Humanities University of Naples Federico II, for the ACADEMIC YEARS 2019/2020 2020/2021, code: 30306 issued in November 10, 2019;
- the accomplishment of the selection procedure held by the Consortium Committee concerning the admission of candidates awarded with Erasmus+ program scholarships;
- DTC Lazio funds available for scholarships as a contribution to the participation costs for admissions to Master ALA;
- Article 9 referring to consortium waiver, other scholarships and self-paying;
- The admission of one (National Technical University of Athens) of the four established feewaivers from ALA Consortium partners,



the Consortium Committee announces

• The extended deadline for maximum 20 candidates (architects and archaeologists and all the admitted degrees of the main call) wishing to apply to the ALA Master as self-paying students until 31 of May 2019 (23:59 CET).

The participation costs will be different for students from Programme Countries and students from Partner Countries as follows: *Programme Country students* (all EU Countries¹ + Non-EU Countries - North Macedonia, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, Serbia, Turkey) must pay the participation costs of € 9.000 (nine-thousand euros) for two years, or € 4.500 (four-thousand euros) per year, or € 2.250 (two-thousand five hundred euros) per semester. *Partner Country students* (Regions 1-14) must pay the participation costs of € 18.000 (eighteen-thousand euros) for two years, or € 9.000 (nine-thousand euros) per year, or € 4.500 (four-thousand five hundred euros) per semester. Participation costs cover: Student insurance for two years / Selection and Registration/ University fee (overheads) / ALA workshops and field trips / Design studios/ Pedagogical Material/ Educational trips to archaeological areas/ Course exams/ Thesis examination/ Library access/ Administrative-Managerial expenditures/ Publications of students' works/ Organization of conference to promote students' works/ Cost for issuing the diploma and the Diploma Supplement/ Publicity and Dissemination of the course and the outcomes of students' work/ Organisation of online courses. Participation costs do not cover accommodation, living expenses, travel or visa costs. Self-paying candidates will have to provide adequate proof of financial sustainability for the whole course duration.

• Three feewaivers available for three excellent candidates holding an second level Archaeology degree from Sapienza University of Rome, University of Coimbra and Naples Federico II (ALA Consortium partners). Feewaivers are free from participation costs. Any other expenses, such as accommodation, travel, installation, insurance and subsistence are not paid by the consortium. The deadline for submitting the application will be the 31 of May 2019 (23:59 CET).

• Three scholarships amounting 5.265 EUR in total each funded by DTC Lazio available as a contribution to the due participation costs (of 9.000 EUR), reserved to Italian candidates holding a second level Archaeology degree. Any other expenses, such as accommodation, travel, installation, insurance and subsistence are not paid by the consortium. The deadline for submitting the application will be the 31 of

May 2019 (23:59 CET).

• In addition to the required documents for admission established in the original call (deadline 20th february), candidates must include a certified document that attests the official length (i.e. number of years) of the university study program held. Architects candidates must also include an official document that certifies the recognition of the university degree by the National Association of Architects or the enrolment in the Professional Register in their country of origin.
